




Scholarship for Indigenous students

Application package 2025



Program and Eligibility

The imagery in this application form incorporates the theme of the 7 Sacred Teachings which include love (represented by an eagle), respect (buffalo), courage (bear), honesty (sabe or sasquatch), wisdom (beaver), humility (wolf) and truth (turtle). The teachings share the concept of abiding by a moral respect for all living things and provide guiding principles in the collaboration toward the restoration of cultural values, beliefs and practices.

Purpose

Our scholarships for Indigenous students work to address the education inequity faced by Indigenous peoples in Alberta by making post-secondary studies more financially accessible. We award 9 scholarships of \$1,500 annually to individuals who are active in their communities and display financial need.

Eligibility criteria

- · Member of a First Nation or band, or has Inuit, Métis or Indian status as referenced on the Indigenous Services Canada website at sac-isc.gc.ca/eng/1100100032374/1572457769548.
- · Resident of Alberta and living in the province for the past 12 months.
- · Enrolled in any full-time post-secondary certificate or diploma program of 2 or more years duration including graduate level studies.
- · Has not received the Alberta Blue Cross Indigenous scholarship in the past.
- Must be attending an Alberta accredited post-secondary institution, as listed below.

All applicants must clearly describe their community involvement, personal goals and financial need, and submit 2 reference letters for evaluation.

What to include in your application

Note: incomplete applications will not be considered.

Follow the steps below to complete your application

- **Step 1:** Complete the application form found on page 4.
- Step 2: List or describe your involvement with community or school-sponsored events or organizations during the past 2 years—use the space provided on pages 5 and 6, or provide as an attachment to your application.
- Step 3: Share a short story of 500 to 1,500 words about yourself, including your financial reasons for applying for the scholarship, your educational and personal goals and how you would like to give back to your community please use the space provided on pages 7 and 8, or provide as an attachment to your application.
- Step 4: Complete the declaration on page 9.

Additional pieces you must provide include

- · Proof of your status or membership (for example, a copy of your Métis status card, Indian status card or band or First Nations membership card. This is only required for those selected to receive the scholarship. As per privacy legislation, our copy of your status card will be destroyed promptly within 30 days);
- a letter confirming your attendance from 1 of the accredited post-secondary educational institutions named within this application (most registrar's offices can provide this for you); and
- · 2 reference letters from relevant individuals or organizations, such as an instructor or professor, someone within the Indigenous community or a program director or supervisor from an Indigenous association with which you've been involved.

Application deadline

The deadline to apply is Wednesday, January 31, 2025 at 11:59 p.m. Applications received after the deadline will not be considered.

When will recipients be notified?

Successful applicants will be notified by March 3, 2025. Funds will be awarded by March 31, 2025.
